AVAILABLE JOBS INCLUDE...

PROGRAM COUNSELOR:

As the activity leader of the camp day, the Program Counselor is the heart of the camp program. They are responsible for planning and carrying out the games and activities of camp. They should:

- have an active, personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- be able to plan and lead games and activities
- be able to work independently, as well as with a group
- be able to keep the camp program on track
- be able to have a lot of fun yet maintain control
- have completed at least one year of college or work.

CAMPER COUNSELOR:

As the spiritual leader of a cabin, the Counselor is the heart of a camper's experience at camp. They are responsible to care for the campers entrusted to them. They should:

- have an active, personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- A enjoy spending time with kids and teens
- be willing to accept supervision and guidance
- ✤ be a person of good character
- be patient, flexible, enthusiastic, and have a sense of humor
- be a high school graduate or at least 18 years of age

JUNIOR COUNSELOR:

The Junior Counselor (Counselor-in-Training) are an essential part of the camper's experience at camp. They assist the Counselor with the campers throughout the day. They should:



♣ be involved in a Christian

youth program or have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ

▲ be willing to help Counselor as needed.

A enjoy spending time with kids

▲ be at least 16 years of age.

JUNIOR STAFF COUNSELOR:

As the spiritual leader of the Junior Staff, the Counselor is the heart of a Junior Staff's work experience at camp. They work directly with the teens who serve at camp cleaning the bathrooms, working in the kitchen, and helping with the camp program. They should:

- have an active, personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- have a desire to work with and mentor teens in a camp setting.
- ▲ be able to create a positive work atmosphere
- be able to supervise and encourage the teens as they do their jobs
- ✤ be able to lead Junior Staff devotional time
- have completed at least one year of college or work

JUNIOR STAFF:

The Junior Staff (Staff-in-Training) are an essential part of camp. They serve as dish washers, bathroom cleaners, program helpers, and often bring a lot of fun to camp. They should:

- ♣ be able to be a positive team member
- ♣ be willing to learn new skills
- ♣ be able to accept correction
- be willing to pitch and lend a hand where needed.
- ♣ enjoy being around children.
- ♣ be at least 14 years of age.

LIFEGUARD:

The Lifeguards oversee the pool and pond water activities - by far the favorite activity of most campers. They should:

- have current certification in CPR and American Red Cross Lifeguard Training or their equivalent
- be willing to help kids gain positive water experiences
- A enjoy being around children and teens
- show maturity, enthusiasm, and have a good attitude
- ▲ must be at least 16 years of age

COOK & COOK'S HELPER:

We have learned the way to a camper's heart is through their stomach. The cook and their helpers are responsible for preparing the camp's meals. They should:

- ▲ have experience in cooking for 50 or more
- people (if possible)
- be able to work well with the kitchen staff and the Junior Staff
- have good timemanagement skills
- have ServSafe certification, but it is not required
- ★ be able to take direction

BIBLE TEACHER (VOLUNTEER):

Bible teachers teach in the morning for grades 1-3 and 4-6 (kids weeks) and grades 7-11 (teen weeks). They should:

- have an active, personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- the ability to communicate and teach the gospel in an effective, age-appropriate way.
- the ability to adjust teaching style to meet the behavioral and spiritual needs of the campers
- ♣ be willing to pray for and with the campers
